21. Lube tip: insights into oil additives

By simply including an additive, an inferior base oil cannot be converted into a premium product. It is illogical to use poor-quality oil on a continuing basis, and attempt to overcome its poor lubricating qualities with some special additive. A far better approach is to determine the manufacturer's recommendation as to the minimum API service rating required (API is a standard of quality grade for engine oil made by the American Petroleum Association), and then regularly use a blended lubricant of a higher-service classification than originally recommended, if an improvement in lubrication is the objective. 22. Lube tip: aftermarket oil additives can backfire

Increasing the percentage of a certain additive may improve one property of an oil, while at the same time degrading another. When the specified concentrations of additives become unbalanced, overall oil quality can be affected. Some additives compete with each other for the same space on a metal surface. For example, if a high concentration of an anti-wear agent is added to the oil, the corrosion inhibitor may become less effective.

23. Lube tip: the evolution of oil filtration systems

Early automotive engines didn't use any kind of filtration for the oil. It wasn't until a patent was granted to Ernest Sweetland and George Greenhalgh in 1923 - for their product the "pure oil later" or "Purolator" - that you could buy an automobile with a full-pressure lubrication system.

It would be many years later before a full-flow oil filter found on today's vehicles was incorporated.

The 1940s would bring about filtration systems on mass produced vehicles, and the 1960s made oil filter changes much more convenient with the advent of "spin on" disposable filters. Through the next few decades, advances were made in the internal construction and filter media, making the filters much more efficient. Today, all automotive engines, whether gasoline or diesel, come with filtration that is designed to improve oil



24. Lube tip: too much of a good thing

More is not always the right approach when it comes to using oil additives. In many instances, blending more additive into the oil, does not result in improved performance. Sometimes, adding more additive actually causes the oil's function to deteriorate. In other cases, while the performance of the additive doesn't improve, the duration of service does, in fact, improve.





3. Gold

South Africa's gold reserves were estimated at 6,000 tons in 2018, making up 11% of the world's total reserves. The Witwatersrand Basin and the Barberton area are the primary gold-rich regions. The Witwatersrand Basin is notable for its gold-bearing paleo gravel type deposits.

2. Platinum Group Metals (PGMs)

South Africa holds approximately 91% of the world's platinum group metal reserves, primarily concentrated in the Bushveld Igneous Complex. These metals are essential for various industrial applications, including catalytic converters in vehicles.

Key Gold Mining Areas:

- **Witwatersrand Basin:** The largest gold deposit in the world.
- **Barberton Area:** Known for its greenstone type gold deposits.





The entire project represents an investment of well over 1 billion Kenyan Shillings, and this figure is expected to grow once the mixed-use development is completed. The mall's impact extends beyond retail, serving as a significant economic catalyst for the region. By providing a platform for both established businesses and new ventures, Fusion Capital is actively contributing to Meru's economic development. The mall's construction generated hundreds of jobs, and its operation continues to employ a diverse workforce, from retail staff to security personnel. The presence of anchor tenants and well-known brands attracts a steady stream of visitors, boosting local businesses and stimulating economic activity in the surrounding area.



Materials and Design:

- **Floors**: A mix of high-quality ceramic and granito tiles, stainless steel cladding, and modern shopfront designs in powder-coated aluminum.
- **Glass**: Significant use of glass in the façade and atrium to create naturally lit spaces.

Landscaping: A mix of imported and indigenous landscaping to seamlessly adapt to the environment.



Facilities:

- **Parking**: 220 parking slots on ground and basement levels.
- **Utilities**: Standby power for common areas, a borehole for water supply, and connection to the bulk sewer system.

Security: A perimeter wall and 24/7 security services.



In line with Fusion Capital's commitment to sustainability, the mall incorporates several ecofriendly features, such as energy-efficient lighting and climate control systems, water-saving fixtures, and waste management practices. 
